## Eco Friendly Boating

**Non-Toxic Cleaners** - many products contain phosphates and other chemicals that are toxic to aquatic ecosystems. Before using hazardous products try a natural cleaner like vinegar. Examples:

**fiberglass stains** - Make a paste of baking soda and water and gently rub the mix into the stain. It can also be used to clean onboard showers and heads. Use baking soda with care as it can be abrasive. Use lemon or lime juice as a final wipe-down for a shiny, fresh-smelling finish.

**chrome** - Apple cider vinegar to clean and a fresh cloth with baby oil to restore it to a bright shine.

**brass** - Worcestershire sauce, vinegar and salt solution

**copper fittings** - make a paste of either lemon or lime juice and salt. Rub gently to clean.

**stainless steel** - clean with a cloth dampened with undiluted white vinegar.

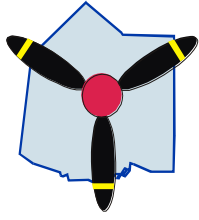

The NORTHERN ONTARIO AVIATION HERITAGE CENTRE would like to thank the THUNDER BAY YACHT CLUB for the return of the compass that was displayed in the Mission Island Building. The compass was originally donated to the club by the Bryan family after it was removed from the family's boat. It will now be displayed with the other items of aviation history in the NOAHC facility on Waterloo Street.

Data available regarding the compass indicates that it was manufactured in 1943 and was used for navigation on a B-17 bomber during the Second World War. No information is available on how it arrived in the city. It had been used as a compass on the Bryan boat before being placed in the yacht club building on the pedestal by the door.

The THUNDER BAY YACHT CLUB will be co-credited as having donated the compass.
